- . . . a holistic awareness of the spiritual core of personhood.

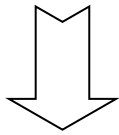
To be education, “Christian education” needs . . .

- . . . utilization and promotion of praxis as the primary mode of Christian learning.

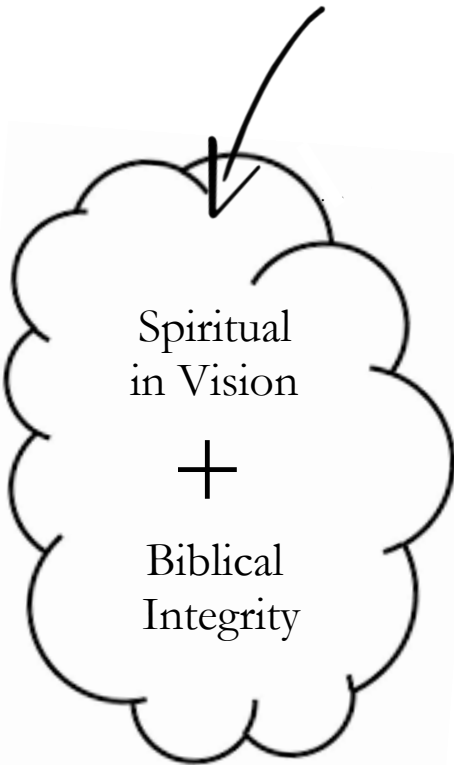

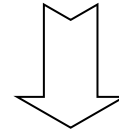
